

Earn Your M.A. in Math Education *Secondary Emphasis*

Now available to Central, Clovis, Fresno and Sanger USD math teachers

who possess a bachelor's degree in mathematics and are interested in qualifying to teach dual-enrollment courses in their high schools or work as adjunct instructors in a community college.

Courses cover a range of mathematics topics such as advanced algebra, geometry and calculus. The program includes courses like Teaching Math for Social Justice and The History of Math. Students will read the research in math education and complete a series of three comprehensive exam papers embedded in the coursework.

Program Highlights:

- ▶ Cohort of 15-20 students
- ▶ Classes begin January 2021 and May 2021
- ▶ Five semesters total with two 3-unit courses per semester
- ▶ All courses are 16 weeks long
- ▶ Synchronous class meetings on Tuesdays 5:30-8:30 p.m.
- ▶ Two hours of asynchronous reading and assignments per class
- ▶ Approximately 90% of the tuition cost will be covered through grants*
- ▶ \$1,500 stipend included to pay for books
- ▶ Equity and race training will better prepare you to serve your students

Program Cost*

- ▶ Tuition: \$21,000
- ▶ Grants:
 - ▶ \$8,000 per student (from the K-16 Collaborative)
 - ▶ \$5,000 per student (from AIMS Foundation)
 - ▶ \$6,000 per student (from Federal Teach Grant)
